



### **Organise your space**

Create a calm, well ordered space where you can revise, away from distractions.



### **Organise your resources**

Make sure that you have everything that you need to succeed. This booklet is a great starting point but you will also need the following for <u>each subject</u>:

- 1. A copy of the exam specification or equivalent detailed list of what the examiner expects you to know from your teacher.
- 2. Copies of assessment materials past papers AND mark schemes.
- 3. Teacher approved reference materials: textbook; revision guide and/or website.

## Organise your time

# Create a revision routine that you can stick to!

- Be honest and realistic. Start by identifying those times when you will not be revising.
- 2. Divide the time remaining fairly between each of your exams. This can be done **EITHER** by preplanning the subjects and topics you will revise **AND/OR** by logging the topics that you cover as you go.
- 3. Commit to the plan. Share it with family members so that they can offer support and encouragement.






There is nothing special about revision. It is just a case of working your way through the topics that you need to know and question practice for each exam.



### Three golden rules:

- 1. Use the exam specification or equivalent checklist from your teacher to identify exactly what the examiner expects you to know about the topic.
- 2. Use your teacher approved reference materials to create NEW NOTES (see below and the next page)
- 3. Revisit your notes on at least two more occasions and apply them to at least two exam style questions/answers between now and the exam.

### You do not need to work alone.

- ✓ Ask your teacher to look over your revision notes,
- ✓ check exam answers against the mark scheme and get your teacher to offer feedback.
- ✓ Use the bulletproof booklet on the next page to fix any mistakes.
- ✓ Don't cut corners. If there is something that you do not understand, speak to your teacher.

# how to control physical reactions to anxiety

### **Deep breathing**

When you become anxious your breathing becomes shallow and fast.

Breathing slowly and deeply will help you calm down and feel in control.

### How do I do it?

sit comfortably with a straight back
place your left hand on your chest, and right hand below it, on your diaphragm
inhale deeply through your nose for 5 seconds
hold your breath for 2 seconds
exhale slowly through your mouth
feel the expansion in your diaphragm

• repeat for 1 or 2 minutes until you feel calm

The **key things to remember** are that: ---you can learn to control anxiety with deep breathing ---many people find it easier to learn with an instructor ---yoga or mindfulness classes can also be helpful

The exam board (Pearson/Edexcel) has provided advance information on the focus June 2022 exams to help pupils revise. The format/structure of the papers remains unchanged. The advance information provides us with the exam specification focus for the questions for two units in Paper 1 (Section 1: Christian beliefs (p.7) and Section 3: Living the Christian life (p.8)) and two units in Paper 2 (Section 1: Muslim Beliefs (p.23) and Section 3: Living the Muslim life (page 24)). # **GCSE History** *History B: The Norman Conquest* OCR (J411/41)

### Summary of advanced information from the exam board:

Pupils will be assessed through four separate, one hour exams, each worth 25% of the final grade. This exam paper will cover The Norman Conquest, 1065-1087. An outline of the content covered in each topic can be found in the specification. There is no further guidance on the specific topics to be assessed within each paper. The exam board has already reduced the overall course content by 20% however by removing the requirement on pupils to sit a fifth exam covering Crime and Punishment from c.1250 to present day.

The exam board (AQA) has provided advance information on the focus of June 2022 exams to help pupils revise The format/structure of the papers remains unchanged.

• For each paper, there is a list which shows the major focus of the content of the exam and another list showing which required practical activities will be assessed (see links below).

- Topics not assessed either directly or through 'linked' content have also been listed.
- Topics not explicitly given in any list may appear in low tariff (mark) questions or via 'linked' questions, which bring together knowledge, skills and understanding from across the specification.
- Pupils will still be expected to apply their knowledge to unfamiliar contexts.
- Assessment of practical skills, maths skills, and Working Scientifically skills will occur throughout all the papers.

• For the Physics papers, pupils will be provided with sheets outlining the equations that they would in other years have had to memorise.

Pupils will be assessed through four separate, one hour exams, each worth 25% of the final grade. This exam paper will cover Living under Nazi rule. An outline of the content covered in each topic can be found in the specification. There is no further guidance on the specific topics to be assessed within each paper. The exam board has already reduced the overall course content by 20% however by removing the requirement on pupils to sit a fifth exam covering Crime and Punishment from c.1250 to present day.
