

Year 11 – ART Programme of Study

At KS4 delivery moves away from the modular material approach of KS3 into a theme heading based folder or sketchbook. Engagement and enthusiasm are nurtured through the research of stimulating artists and experimentation, with a focus on individual ownership of outcomes. Throughout the course, students generally work individually and complete two projects which are structured to meet the breadth and depth of knowledge as prescribed in the AQA assessment specifications. Teacher feedback is personalised to help pupils develop their own ideas. Homework is set on a weekly basis and drop in days for completion of this and other work is offered during lunchtime.
