

Year 11 – ART Programme of Study

At KS4 delivery moves away from the modular material approach of KS3 into a theme heading based folder or sketchbook. Engagement and enthusiasm are nurtured through the research of stimulating artists and experimentation, with a focus on individual ownership of outcomes. Throughout the course, students generally work individually and complete two projects which are structured to meet the breadth and depth of knowledge as prescribed in the AQA assessment specifications. Teacher feedback is personalised to help pupils develop their own ideas. Homework is set on a weekly basis and drop in days for completion of this and other work is offered during lunchtime.

<p>Project 2: ‘Food’ or ‘Connections’</p> <p>Pupils will return to class with a clear intention of what type of artwork they are working towards.</p> <p>In this half term, pupils will continue to create a body of work which demonstrates exploration of materials relevant to their intention.</p> <p>The focus will be on material and compositional refinement.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Milestone Assessment:</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;">During the Year 11 Mock examination week, pupils will have a day (5 hours) to start the piece of work which concludes their personal project.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Between then and the end of term, pupils will finish their concluding piece and present their project work.</p>		<p>GCSE Final Exam: Planning and preparation</p> <p>The AQA Art, Craft and design exam paper is distributed.</p> <p>Pupils will choose ONE title and complete a body of work which evidences the following:</p> <p>Assessment Objectives required by AQA.</p> <p>AO1: Develop ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources.</p> <p>AO2: Refine work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.</p> <p>AO3: Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions as work progresses.</p> <p>AO4: Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and demonstrates understanding of visual language.</p>		<p>GCSE Final Exam: Planning, preparation and completion</p> <p>Complete a piece of art work which concludes the artistic journey for component 2. Pupils have 10 hours to complete this, the first two have to be consecutive.</p> <p>Generally the 10 hours is completed over two days.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Final GCSE Exam to conclude Component 2</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Over 10 hours, under controlled conditions, pupils will have to complete a concluding piece of work for the exam title they have chosen.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">This is usually timetabled over two consecutive days and is completed by the first week in May.</p>
