Actors write up a 2500 word log book as evidence of the devising process. This includes three sections: 1. Response to a Stimulus 2. Collaboration & Development 3. Analysis and Evaluation This is submitted to the teacher and is worth 80 marks. Component 3: Reading and research. Actors read a selection of texts to prepare for the selection of one or two extracts for a Year 11 performance exam the following March.
