## **NICE TO KNOW Remembrance Day Assemblies**

The 11th November is Armistice Day, which marks the anniversary of the end of the First World War in 1918. In common with tradition, the College paused for a two-minute silence to remember those who lost their lives in time of war. In the lead up to the Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday commemorations, each year group has attended a Remembrance Assembly, which has focused this year on three former pupils of the College who were killed during the Normandy Landings of 1944. The names of Robert Chapman, Victor Froste and Alfred Mackay are all commemorated on the College's War Memorial and on the newly created British Normandy Memorial, which was unveiled in Normandy last year. The idea for the Normandy Memorial originated with the Normandy Veteran, George Batts, who died this week at the age of 97, and was in part paid for thanks to the fundraising efforts of another Normandy Veteran, Harry Billinge, who also died earlier this year. It is comforting to know that three of the College's former pupils, who fell on D-Day and during the Battle of Normandy in the summer of 1944, have their names recorded at this place of serene beauty where people will gather to remember and reflect for generations to come.
