# **Weekly Round-Up**

Y11 mock exams finished this week. To celebrate this, we surprised Y11 with an off-curriculum reward on Wednesday afternoon by way of thanking them for their hard work and positive attitudes. Also on Wednesday, we were delighted to run the Cambs Youth COP27, an all-day event discussing climate change, which was attended by 190 pupils from 14 secondary schools. Yesterday was the culmination of a week of activity to mark Children in Need, money raised will go directly to the charity.

Thank you to the overwhelming majority of pupils who understand what it means to be respectful and kind, polite and courteous to all. On a less positive note, some pupils' behaviour is falling far below our expectations, especially in their use of social media and their behaviour in the community, including whilst in uniform. We need parental support in order to maintain high standards and address the poor choices of a small minority of pupils.

#### **NEW** Y11 PISA exams

We have been selected to participate in the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA), which aims to understand how well 15-year-old pupils can apply knowledge and skills in mathematics, science and reading in the UK and internationally. The assessments are designed to test how well the pupils master key subjects in order to be prepared for real-life situations in the adult world. PISA provides an opportunity to compare achievement internationally and encourages countries to learn from each other, creating fairer and more inclusive school systems.

PISA will randomly identify 40 Year 11 pupils to complete the survey and assessment, in school, on Tuesday 6 December. They will not need to do any preparation in advance and we will be contacting the selected parents and pupils with full details next week.

## **REMINDER** Year 9 Photographs

Year 9 pupils will be having their photographs taken on Thursday 24 November. Pupils must be in full school uniform, no jewellery may be worn except two small stud earrings in each ear and make-up is not permitted, with the exception of a light covering of skin coloured foundation.

#### **NICE TO KNOW Sawston COP27**

Our delegation of 12 pupils participated in the Cambridgeshire Youth COP 27 joining 13 other schools, which we hosted and organised. As well as having a lovely lunch, pupils were inspired by the key note speech by Dr Simon Morley, who heads off Antarctica next to continue his BAS research. They also took part in a mock COP27 debate - role playing countries and trying to reach consensus- and workshops designed to encourage greener spaces and sharing ideas for future collaboration and commitments. Each school also planted a tree on site as part of our wider plan to plant 150 trees this term. Pupils learnt that reaching consensus is very difficult but they did agree to a region-wide Eco Council and for each school to take back some clever environmental ideas to their own schools to share with their peers and put into action.
