## **NEW Industrial Action by the National Education Union.**

The NEU is one of a number of education unions but they are the only union currently planning industrial action. Employees are not obliged to inform management of their union membership nor their intention to strike. However, we do have members of the NEU in the College. We will take all reasonable steps to open for as many pupils as possible during the strike, but some disruption is likely on the following planned dates:

- Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2023
- Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> March 2023
- Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2023 Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March 2023

Safeguarding is a key consideration in any decision to close or partially close. We will inform parents next week of our plans for February  $1^{st}$ .

#### **<u>NEW</u> Staff absence**

## **COMMUNITY** Sawston Bypass roadworks

According to the Cambridgeshire County Council roadworks and traffic information, there are scheduled to be roadworks and a potential road closure on the Sawston bypass between 23<sup>rd</sup> January and 3<sup>rd</sup> February. The exact nature of the roadworks and the potential impact is unclear at this point. The roadworks would appear to be in place between the turn off from the bypass onto London Road and the turn off to Mill Lane so it seems that traffic should still be able to access the village from both ends but may not be able to travel along the bypass. This is likely to lead to potential delays so it may be worth taking this into account if you travel to College along that route.
