NEW Staff Update

At the end of the autumn term, as reported in the newsletter, we said goodbye to three members of staff. Miss Farrow, English and TH10, has been temporarily replaced by Miss Richards. Mr Bond, PE, has been temporarily replaced by Ms Whitaker. Ms Wilson-Owen, Librarian, has been permanently replaced by Miss Allen and we look forward to the library now being open five days a week. NEW National Advice to all schools from UK Health Security Agency

All schools nationally have been informed of the following.

Flu and coronavirus (COVID-19) are <u>currently circulating at high levels</u> and are likely to continue to increase in coming weeks. High numbers of scarlet fever, which is caused by group A streptococcus, also <u>continue to be reported</u>.

Professor Susan Hopkins, Chief Medical Adviser at the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), said:

- It's important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and childcare settings as much as possible. If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and the fever has resolved.
- Helping children to learn about the importance of good hand hygiene is also key, so
 practice regular handwashing at home with soap and warm water. Catching coughs
 and sneezes in tissues then binning them is another simple way to help stop illness
 from spreading.















Remember that flu vaccination is still available for all eligible groups and is the best
protection against the virus. The NHS has seen good uptake in older age groups but
vaccination among young children remains low. Flu can be very unpleasant and, in
some cases, can lead to more serious illness. Getting your child vaccinated protects
them and others they come into contact with, and it's still not too late.

NEW Advice on Spending Free School Meals (FSM) Allowance

Pupils who receive FSM have a daily allowance of £2.50 which covers the price of both a main meal and dessert in the canteen. Pupils have the choice of when and where they use this money but if it is spent at breaktime they may not have enough left for lunch. Please ensure that your child is informed on their options for spending this money.

NEW Pupil Premium (PP) and Free School Meals (FSM)

We would like to share more information about applying for FSM. Once a pupil has FSM they are considered as PP. If you would like more information about what this means, or to look at the strategy, please follow this link: https://sawstonvc.org/information/pupil-premium/. Below are the eligibility criteria taken from the gov.uk website:

Your child will get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC)) that does not exceed £16,190
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work less hours per week
- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (as from 1 April 2018).
