## **NEW** Henry Morris Travel Awards – free trips home and abroad

Every year, the Henry Morris Memorial Trust offers pupils the chance to apply for financial awards. These awards are for pupils aged 13-19 for 'travel with purpose' or for 'home-based projects'. In previous years, pupils have travelled, alone or in groups, to destinations in the UK and abroad like the Norfolk coast, Stratford, Edinburgh, Paris, Rome and Amsterdam. Home based projects have included building a virtual reality drone, restoring a wrecked 'cello and making a Regency style dress.

Pupils apply by using the application form on the website (<u>www.henrymorris.org</u>). The deadline is the 31<sup>st</sup> January 2024. Successful applicants will be interviewed at Queens' College, Cambridge University on a Saturday in March. After the successful pupils have completed their projects, they are required to write a report and financial prizes are given for the best ones.
