

Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back from your Head of House

With pupils due to return to the classroom this week (Y7 and 11 - Wednesday; Y8, 9 and 10 - Thursday), we are very much looking forward to seeing our young people and hearing about their summer breaks. 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Each house will also have a pool of Learning Mentors who will carry out a 1-1 Learning Review Meeting with each pupil once a term during Mentor Time. This will be an opportunity for your child to review their academic progress and consider any actions required to support their learning.

This year, we will see a return to more regular House Assemblies for Y7 - 10 and, alongside this, additional opportunities for Y11 to receive CEIAG and core subject intervention through mentor times. Mentor Groups will continue to receive important daily notices each morning, engage in theme weeks and competitions, celebrate and acknowledge important dates throughout the year.

Uniform Expectations

We would like to thank you in advance for ensuring that your child returns to school in full uniform. We appreciate that times are challenging at present and would like to remind parents/carers that the College has second hand uniform available on request via [this google form](#). Please do bear with our admin team if you have used this form during the summer break, they will be in touch with you as soon as they can.

In order to allow for a smooth start, please ensure that your children do not return to school with:

- unnaturally coloured hair (blue, green, pink etc.);
- false eyelashes or lash extensions;
- acrylic / shellac or painted nails;
- nose piercings (except clear spacers);
- black jeans;
- leggings;
- tracksuit bottoms;
- skirts which are tight against the skin and above the knee.

Punctuality and Attendance

The process to report a pupil absence remains the same as last year. In preference, please use the link on the website each morning to inform us if your child is not going to be able to come into school, for ease this can also be found [here](#). If you do not have access to the website, please telephone 01223 712623 (Attendance Office) or email attendance@sawstonvc.org each day that your child is absent.

Punctuality is extremely important to us as a school. Pupils arriving late to lessons miss key learning and disrupt the learning of others by interrupting teachers who have started their lessons. Pupils arriving late to mentor time miss key information from the daily bulletin, disrupt the beginning of assemblies and make pastoral care more challenging for their

mentors. We take a firm line on punctuality, both when arriving at school in the morning and also to each lesson.

Mentor time begins at 8.30am and pupils should be coming through the gates before 8.25am in order to be on time. Parents and carers will be contacted if their child is late to school more than once in a week and sanctions will be issued to pupils who are repeatedly late to school or to lessons. Teachers will of course use their discretion if there is a legitimate reason for lateness (music lessons, speaking to a member of staff), the pupil will not be given a late mark on the register as they are on the College site. If buses are late or there is a significant, beyond usual, traffic issue whilst late marks will be issued, they will not be considered in terms of a sanction.

Finally, a reminder that we cannot authorise leave of absence for the purpose of a family holiday, therefore we request that holidays are not booked during term time. New build

The building work has begun on site. The compound is now in place on the playground and part of the field. The bus bays at the front are nearing completion. We will share information via the weekly Friday communication with parents as the work develops. The website will also be updated over the coming days.

When pupils return to school, we will explain to them the changes and share information including emergency evacuation routes and muster points. Pupils travelling on buses will be met and directed to safe routes into school. All pupils on foot and cycling should use the main gate only to enter the College. Parents are requested to drop off children away from New Road to avoid congestion. Parents should avoid parking near the bus bay area or using the Sports Centre gate entrance.
