NICE TO KNOW Duke of Edinburgh's Award Silver Qualifying Expedition

Congratulations to the 27 pupils from Y11 who braved the autumnal mix of high winds, heavy downpours and cold nights to successfully complete their qualifying expedition for the Silver Duke of Edinburgh's Award over the period 12th-14th September. The expedition was held in the White Peak area of the Peak District over hilly terrain with participants walking a minimum of seven hours per day carrying all of their expedition equipment. Having completed the expedition section of their award our participants are now able to focus on their work towards completion of the volunteering, physical and skills sections. We wish them well for their continuing adventures.

This summer, three pupils very kindly volunteered to assist the staff at Sawston Library with the promotion and delivery of their Story Garden, Summer Reading Challenge. The Summer Reading Challenge is a national reading campaign to encourage children aged 4-11 years to read lots of books during the school summer holidays.

Volunteers have helped in promoting and delivering the Reading Challenge to children, their parents/carers and assisting with supporting events and activities. This summer almost 7,000 children took part in the Summer Reading Challenge across Cambridgeshire Libraries, and the support of young volunteers has been invaluable.

NICE TO KNOW Y11 Physics at Work exhibition

On Tuesday, the Science Department took 57 Y11 pupils to the "Physics at Work" exhibition, held at Cambridge University's new Ray Dolby Centre. We saw a mix of exhibitors from both research and industry. The exhibition focused on inspiring pupils, showing them the range of career opportunities that are made available by studying physics and the possible examination choices they might consider for Y12. One of the highlights of the trip was a hands-on demonstration of the practical uses of superconductors: using liquid nitrogen to operate a model magley train on magnetic rails.

NICE TO KNOW Y10 devised performance workshop

This week, Y10 Drama took part in a full-day devising workshop facilitated by Richard James-Neale—a distinguished actor and director with credits including Frantic Assembly, Shakespeare's Globe and The National Theatre. Our newly formed GCSE classes hit the ground running, working both as a full cohort and in smaller groups, engaging in physical theatre, devising research, storytelling through movement and script writing. They collaborated in a professional manner, using industry-standard methods to generate innovative and creative material. The workshop has left them with a wealth of ideas to launch their devising process, and we look forward to seeing their examination pieces in May 2026.
