NEW Site Update

The old Health and Social Care/DI Hub Mobile has been demolished. Given the weather, we have also been able to reseed the field rather than wait for spring. Work has begun in the Sports Hall and Gymnasium but only investigatory work as exams are taking place in an adjacent hall. We are being very careful to minimise any disruption. Foundation works have started in the main compound. Unfortunately, the kiosk has yet to be moved but plans are still to achieve this later this half-term. Finally, we hope to move into the temporary PE rooms once building control has been fully signed off this month. Another polite reminder that there can be no parking on the bus bays between 7.30-9am and 2.30-3.30pm. This area is also out of bounds to pupils (except for access to buses) and they should not use the Arts/Sport Centre gate entrance or exit.
